



Trauma Symptom Checklist for Children™ (TSCC™)

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PURPOSE	To evaluate acute and chronic posttraumatic symptoms in children
ADMINISTER TO	Individuals 8-16 years old
ADMINISTRATION TIME	20 minutes
SCORING OPTIONS	Hand-scorable

The TSCC is a self-report measure of posttraumatic stress and related psychological symptomatology in children who have experienced traumatic events (e.g., physical or sexual abuse, major loss, natural disaster, witness violence).

ASSESSMENT SCALES

The 54-item TSCC includes two validity scales: Under-response and Hyper-response, eight critical items, as well as six clinical scales:

- Anxiety
- Anger
- Sexual Concerns
- Depression
- Posttraumatic Stress
- Dissociation



AREAS OF APPLICATION

The TSCC is most commonly used and best suited for therapeutic settings.

REPORT OPTION

Since the TSCC is a hand-scorable assessment, there are currently no software reports available.
